

Miracles: Scientific and Theological Perspectives

The very word 'Miracle' raises a host of questions: 'How is the word used in popular language/theologically?' 'What is a miracle?' 'Can one define a miracle?' 'Have miracles ever happened?' 'Do they occur today?' 'How does God work in a world characterised by a chain-mesh of cause/effect?' 'Should we use the terms natural/supernatural?' 'How do theological claims about miracles relate to world-views and to scientific laws?' 'How damaging are Hume's arguments against miracles in his essay, *Of Miracles?*'

In addition to attempting to address such questions there will be echoes of past pronouncements from Woolwich and Durham as well as a Noddy story.

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
