

The Electronic Publishing of Science & Christian Belief

The year 2004 marks an important milestone in the life of *Science & Christian Belief* as the journal finally enters the electronic era. The journal is now being published in either hard copy or electronic formats and the subscription for either is identical. Some libraries and individuals may choose to subscribe only to the electronic version, so saving on shipping costs. Many, however, are likely to continue subscribing to the print copy, but in addition will now be able to gain access to the electronic version by paying a small extra handling charge (via their regular subscription channel) which secures the user number and password required to gain access to the full text of the journal. The journal web-site is at www.scienceandchristianbelief.org

The site is accessible to non-subscribers who can browse the Contents pages and utilise the search-engine to identify Articles and Abstracts of interest, together with Book Reviews, Correspondence, Debate sections and Editorials. However, only subscribers have access to pdf read-only full-text files of these materials which can be either read on screen or printed off to read later. In addition all back-issues of the journal, starting with Issue 1/1 published in April 1989, will be made available on the site and will be accessed in the same way. Those with electronic subscriptions, either stand-alone or as add-ons to their print subscriptions, will also receive e-mail notification when the latest Issue has been published on the web-site. In addition, non-subscribers are able to order individual reprints of articles or Book Reviews for flat-fee payments and these can be sent to them either by e-mail as pdf files or as hard copy. Authors should also note that the web-site makes available an 'Instructions for Authors' document and either Articles or Book Reviews can be submitted electronically using the information available on the inside back-cover of the journal.

There is little doubt that the electronic publishing of *Science & Christian Belief* in parallel with the print-copy provides considerable 'added value' to subscriptions. In contrast to the average annual 8% inflation rates that are common for many scientific journals, the subscription rates for *Science & Christian Belief* remain modest indeed, and we are convinced that the journal represents very good value for money when compared to other multidisciplinary journals on the market. This means that the journal remains financially accessible to those many readers who obtain it via membership of a particular professional organisation.
